

WEBELOS RESIDENT CAMP 2008

General Information: The theme for the Cub Scout Webelos Camp is “**Our World to Explore**”.



Webelos Resident Camp is a special program with three nights of camping which will be filled with fun and adventure. Our purpose is to help prepare Webelos and adults for the transition into Boy Scouting. The Webelos will have many hands-on experiences including camp set-up, meal preparation, archery, BB guns, as well as many other Scout activities. The program is operated under certified leadership, in an established Scout camp owned by the Abraham Lincoln Council.

Adult Leaders: One adult may bring up to four Webelos Scouts from the same Pack or a Webelos Scout and his Adult Partner may attend on their own. Webelos Scouts must have a responsible adult in camp at all times, always maintaining at least a 1 to 4 ratio. Along with program activities we will offer adults time for Leader Training Sessions including New Leader Essentials, Webelos Den Leader Training, and Youth Protection Training. There will also be a Webelos to Boy Scout Orientation presented. Be prepared for a weekend of nonstop experiences for both adults and Webelos Scouts.

Parent and Leader Orientation: The 2008 Webelos Camp Staff invites every parent and leader to come to Camp Illinek on **Thursday, May 15th at 6:00 PM** for an Orientation Session. The Camp Director and Camp Program Director will be on hand to explain this year's program, camp procedures and policies, answer any questions you may have, and take you on a tour of Camp Illinek. Bring the family. Hot dogs, chips, and a drink will be provided. The evening will conclude around a campfire. Hope to see you there!

Health Forms and Medication: Each Webelos Scout and his Adult Partner attending camp must complete a BSA Class 1 Personal Health and Medical Record Form (included in this brochure). Additional copies may be copied as needed, obtained at the Council Service Center or at our council web site at www.alincolnbsa.org.

If an adult or a Scout requires a special diet, or has any special medical needs, please submit an explanation in writing at the time of registration to the Council Service Center.

Registration: Registration for Webelos Resident Camp may be completed as a Pack or individually. To register individually, complete the enclosed Cub Scout Camp Registration Form and health forms. Submit them, along with your payment, to the Council Service Center by May 16, 2008 to receive the on-time cost. Payment received after May 16, 2008 will have a late payment charge of \$15.00 added to their fees.

****NEW FOR THIS YEAR****

Pack Registration: This year we are offering a new way to register for camp. If a Pack attends together, they can also register that way. Pack registration offers a boy who may not otherwise be able to attend camp a chance to come with friends. It also has a financial benefit. If a Pack registers together they will be given a discount of \$5.00 per boy.* To register as a Pack, please complete the enclosed Camp Registration Form and submit it along with your payment and health form(s) to your **Pack Coordinator**. Your Coordinator will complete the necessary Pack Registration Form and submit all Registrations to the Council Service Center together. Pack registration requires a minimum of 6 youth and 2 adults. Pack registrations are due by May 16, 2008 to receive the on-time cost.

*The \$5.00 pack registration discount applies to Cub Scout and Webelos Resident Camp only. Only one discount per scout is allowed.

Multiple Camp Discounts: A discount of \$10.00 is given to Scouts who attend multiple camps, Register for two of three events (Day Camp, Resident Camp or Webelos camp) at the same time and receive a \$10.00 discount. If you are planning to attend more than one camp make sure to get your discount.

Dates: 3-Night Session 1July 10-13
3-Night Session 2July 17-20

Eligible: Scouts currently enrolled in Grades 3 & 4 in the spring of 2008. Any Scout currently in Grade 5 should be crossing over into Boy Scouts and thus, be heading to Boy Scout Camp with his Troop this summer.

Fees: Scout - Fee includes all meals, all program materials, the Webelos Camp T-shirt, and a Participant Patch.

\$95.00
+\$15.00 Late payment fee if not paid by May 16, 2008.
\$110.00 If late payment fee is added.

Adult - Fee includes all meals and a Participant Patch. If an adult wishes to purchase a Camp T-shirt at the time of registration they may do so for an additional \$14.00 for sizes S, M, L, or XL; \$16.00 for sizes 2XL and 3XL. The payment for the T-shirt is due with your registration fee.

Payment Schedule: It is preferred that all fees be paid in full at the time of Registration. If this is not possible, a deposit fee of \$20.00 per person is due with initial registration. (The deposit is non-refundable, but can be transferred to another person's deposit.) In order to avoid a late payment fee, the balance of \$75.00 per Scout and \$50.00 per adult is due in full by May 16, 2008. After this date the late payment fee will be charged and the cost will be \$110.00 per Scout and \$70.00 per adult (less any applicable deposit).

Schedule: Check-in is on Thursday from 6:00-8:00 PM at Booth Lodge at Camp Illinek (please no early arrivals). After registering, campers will set up camp in their assigned campsite. The weekend program will begin at 8:30 with a Campfire Program at the Firebowl put on by the Camp Staff. Adult and youth campers are invited to separate Cracker Barrel Sessions after the Campfire. **There will be no meals on Thursday night.** The weekend will end with the Closing Ceremony on Sunday morning.
