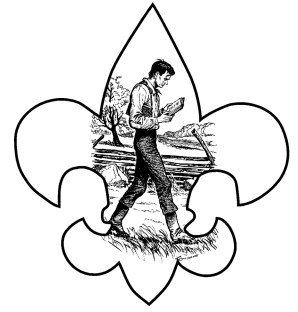


Abraham Lincoln Council Camp Staff Application (2010)



It is the goal of the Abraham Lincoln Council to provide those who attend our camps with an unparalleled experience. We are seeking dedicated people willing to serve the youth of our communities by joining one of this year's summer camp staffs.

The standards of the Scout Oath and Law will serve as a guide for all staff conduct. The use of alcohol or illegal drugs will not be tolerated during the period of service on staff. The use of tobacco (by adults) is restricted to areas where employees are not in contact with scouts or their leaders. The staff will set an example of excellence in Scouting which includes the proper wearing of the full uniform and the proper use of equipment while in camp.

All summer program staff, *paid or volunteer*, are required to provide the camp, upon their arrival, with a current health history and the results of an up-to-date physical examination per current BSA policy. The Federal Immigration and Control Act (enacted on November 6, 1986) requires all employers to verify that each applicant is legally authorized to work in the United States. You will be required to provide documents to verify your eligibility as required by this law. All employees 18 and older will be subject to a background check
