Cub Scout Roundtable

What is a Cub Scout Roundtable?

It is supplemental training for volunteers at the pack level. Roundtable provides a fun environment to give these pack leaders: program ideas, information on policy, events, training opportunities, and an opportunity to share experiences and fellowship with other Cub Scout leaders.

What goes on at a Cub Scout Roundtable?

The Roundtable staff demonstrates the elements of a model meeting that leaders may use as a pattern for their own den or pack meeting. This meeting is based on the next month's theme so that you have the information and ideas in advance. From this roundtable experience we hope to be able to provide the leaders with what they need to provide a stronger program for their Tiger Cubs, Cub Scouts and Webelos Scouts.

What does this model meeting consist of?

Icebreakers, gathering ideas, opening ceremonies, cheers, applauses, songs, games, skits, theme related activities, advancement and recognition ceremonies, training highlights, and closing ceremonies. All wrapped up with lots of fun. We also have breakout sessions for Den Leaders, Webelos Den Leaders, Pack Leaders, and Cubmasters.

What are the breakout sessions for?

The breakout sessions give specific ideas for specific leaders. The Den Leaders sessions focus on theme-related activities, including methods of adapting these activities to include Tiger Cub adult partners. The Webelos Den Leader sessions provide ideas for activity badges, the Webelos badge, and the Arrow of Light Award. The Cubmaster/Pack Leader sessions focus on the elements of running a fun and well-organized pack meeting. They also concentrate on ways to improve the pack's overall program.

When are Cub Scout Roundtables?

They are the second Thursday of the month from September through May at 7:00 p.m.

Where are Cub Scout Roundtables?

In September and May they are at Booth Lodge at Camp Illinek. The rest of the months they are at Grace Lutheran Church at 714 E. Capitol Avenue in Springfield. There is plenty of parking in the Church parking lot across from the church on Seventh Street.

Do you offer something for my kids while I attend Roundtable?

Roundtable Daycare services is for youth 5 - 12 years of age only. There is no other assigned area for youth and they are not allowed anywhere else.
