TRAINING FOR ALL

American Heart Association CPR	The CPR Course teaches the lifesaving skills of adult Hands-Only CPR, adult CPR with breaths, child CPR with breaths, adult and child AED use, infant CPR, and mild and severe airway block for adults, children, and infants. Skills are taught in a dynamic group environment using the AHA's research-proven practice-while-watching technique, which provides students with the most hands-on CPR practice time possible.
First Aid skills training	Do you need to sharpen your first aid skills? Maybe learn a new technique to take back to your unit?
Leave No Trace 101	The course aims to generate a general awareness of Leave No Trace principles and to impart several practical skills enabling participants to make ethical decisions in the outdoors. The course is one of the levels of Leave No Trace training in the Boy Scouts of America.

SCOUTS BSA YOUTH TRAINING

Conversations with Adults	Do you have concerns when talking to adults? Are you unsure about what adults might say when you have a great idea to make your Troop more fun? Learn why different generations have trouble talking to each other and how you can take steps to breakdown the barriers.
Den Chief Training	Prepares a Scout for the responsibilities and skills required to work with Cub Scouts and Cub Scout Leaders. This training also meets requirement 2 for the Den Chief Service Award.
Earning awards beyond rank	There is more to Scouting then Merit Badges and Ranks. Have you heard of the Hornaday Award, or the Conservation Award? Attend this session to learn more about additional awards within the BSA that you can earn.
ILST - Introduction to Leadership Skill Troop	The purpose of the <i>Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops (ILST)</i> course is to teach Scouts with leadership positions about their new roles and how to reach success in that role most effectively. It is intended to help Scouts in leadership positions within their troop understand their responsibilities and to equip them with organizational and leadership skills to fulfill those responsibilities. ILST is the first course in the series of leadership training offered to Scouts and is a replacement for Troop Leadership Training. Completion of ILST is a prerequisite for Scouts to participate in the more advanced leadership courses National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) and the National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE).

SCOUTS BSA YOUTH EDUCATION

American Labor	<p>The labor movement in America seeks to ensure that the civil rights of laborers are protected in the workplace, especially in regard to wages, hours, and working conditions.</p> <p>Prerequisite: None, Blue Card Required</p>
Collections	<p>Collecting can be an educational and financially rewarding pastime: a collector must educate himself about a specific subject, be able to tell which items are worth preserving, how to catalog and organize his collection, and how to evaluate the value of items.</p> <p>Please bring a tri-fold or poster board display with pictures of you collection, an essay including 1, 2, 3, and your blue card. These will be displayed in the midway for the day. Do not bring actual collection.</p>
Composite Materials & NOVA WHOOSH	<p>Composite Materials: Composites can be found just about everywhere; in airplanes and sports cars, golf clubs and guitars, boats and baseball bats, bathtubs and circuit boards, and even bridges. Composites make bicycles and skis lighter, kayaks and canoes stronger, houses warmer, and helmets tougher.</p> <p>Prerequisites: 4(a)or(b), 6 Blue Card Required</p> <hr/> <p>Whoosh! The Boy Scouts of America developed the Nova Awards program to excite and expand a sense of wonder in our Scouts. By working with an adult counselor or mentor, the various modules allow them to explore the basic principles of STEM and discover how fun and fascinating STEM can be. The Supernova awards are offered for those who enjoy a super challenge. This module is designed to help you explore how engineering affects your life each day.</p> <p>Prerequisites: 1(A)or(B)or(C), 4 (A)or(B)</p>
Crime Prevention & Fingerprinting	<p>Crime Prevention: Preventing crime, which can be as simple as reducing the opportunities for crime to occur, is far less costly than apprehending and bringing legal action against those who break the law and it helps save people from the anguish of being victims.</p> <p>Prerequities: 2, 6, 7 Blue Card Required</p> <hr/> <p>Fingerprinting: In earning the Fingerprinting merit badge, Scouts will learn about and use an important technique that is used by law enforcement officers, along with other materials like matching dental records and DNA sampling, to help identify amnesia victims, missing persons, abducted children, and others.</p> <p>Prerequisites: None, Blue Card Required</p>
Fire Saftey	<p>The ability to use fire safely is essential to human survival. By earning this merit badge, Scouts will learn to uses fire safely and responsibly, how to prevent home fires, and how to handle fire safely, as well as burn prevention, and camping safety.</p> <p>Prerequisites: 6 Blue Card Required</p>

Nuclear Science	<p>Nuclear science gives us a simple explanation of the natural world. The ultimate goal of nuclear science is to find out if there is one fundamental rule that explains how matter and forces interact. Earning the Nuclear Science merit badge is a chance for Scouts to learn about this exciting field at the cutting edge of science today.</p> <p>Prerequisite: None Blue Card Required</p>
Scouting Heritage	<p>Introduces Scouts to the history of the Boy Scouts of America. They'll learn it all—from Scouting's beginnings under Lord Baden-Powell to the history of their own troop.</p> <p>Prerequisite: 5, 6, 7 Blue Card Required</p>

VENTURING TRAINING

Crew Mentorship	<p>An important part of being a Venturer is leadership and personal growth. Mentoring is a form of leadership and can be performed in a variety of circumstances throughout the Venturing program. This training is designed to help Venturers understand how to mentor other members of the crew and appreciate the role mentoring plays for both the mentee and mentor.</p>
ILSC - Introduction to Leadership Skills Crew	<p>The purpose of the <i>Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews (ILSC)</i> course is to teach crew members with leadership positions about their new roles and how to reach success most effectively in that role. It is intended to help Venturers in leadership positions within their crew understand their responsibilities and to equip them with organizational and leadership skills to fulfill those responsibilities. <i>Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews</i> is the first course in the series of leadership training offered to Venturers and is a replacement for the Venturing Leadership Skills Course. Completion of <i>Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews</i> is a prerequisite for Venturers to participate in the more advanced leadership courses <i>National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)</i> and the <i>National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE)</i>. It is also required for <i>Kodiak Challenge</i>.</p>

ADULT TRAINING

Adult Leader Awards	<p>Remember to recognize all the hard workers in your unit! From simple ways to thank them to awards available to your adults. Covers the changes in the new awards guide released by National.</p>
Advancement 101 & Scoutbook	<p>Learn to track advancements, awards, contact list, upload photos and, send messages to your unit, plan events a year in advance all from one tool. Work smarter by using this user friendly web based tool that will keep your unit informed, connected and engaged. This tool is both Windows and Apple friendly, will work with your desktops, laptops, iPad and yes, even your cell phone.</p>

Annual Planning Tips and Tricks	The Annual PLC is the most important planning session your Unit has! It can make or break the success of your Unit. Discover how to incorporate Fun, Safety, Outdoor Adventure, Advancement, desires of the Scouts, and the guidance of Adult Leaders in your Annual Unit Plan. (Every Unit should have at least one Adult Leader attend!)
Beyond the Rank Troop & Cub Awards	Not all Scouts are motivated by advancement, and that's OK. Learn about different opportunities to earn special awards that can help keep Scouts interested and boost your unit retention.
Committee Position Specific	Basic Training for Unit Committee Members.
Cubmaster Specific	Basic Training for Cubmasters and Assistant Cubmasters.
Den Leader Specific	This course encompassing the Tiger Leader, Cub Leader and Webelos Leader training. All three classes are the same and will allow you to take additional classes at University of Scouting.
Family Scouting	Family Scouting now includes girls, Lions and other changes from BSA. Learn what's new in Scouting.
Hazardous Weather	Learn how to mitigate environmental risks while on outings, and what the BSA recommends you do if caught in an unexpected weather event while outing. This course is a requirement to be considered fully trained as a direct contact leader.
How can a Crew help with your program?	Having an associated Venture Crew can be an asset for a Troop that struggles to keep older members. They can also provide a programming resource for a Pack or a Troop. Learn more about the Venturing program and how it can help build your unit program.
Merit Badge Counselor	Learn how Merit Badges fit into the advancement program, what you need to do to become a Merit Badge Counselor, BSA and local procedures to follow, "Blue Cards," and the nuts and bolts of working with Scouts on Merit Badges.
Multi Gender Camping	A conversation about camping with male and female Scouts and Scouters. What does the Guide to Safe Scouting say?
NOVA/SuperNOVA Introduction	This course will provide an overview of the BSA STEM Nova program and why this program is important to the BSA and to all Scouts. This training will provide information to promote the STEM Nova program to units and adult leaders.
NOVA Programs - Practical Planning	Now that you have learned about the Nova/STEM program, come learn the tools for implementing the Nova / Supernova program into your Den, Pack, Troop or Crew. This hands-on training will allow you to do experiments involving catapults, slime, bungee jumping and more. Learn great ways to make the Nova program fun for all involved.
NOVA/SuperNOVA Counselor Training	Find out how to serve as a mentor for BSA's Nova/SuperNova (STEM) program. Learn the details of the program and how to successfully guide Scouts to completion. See how adults can work as Nova Counselors or Supernova Mentors and earn a trained card for these roles. Course is appropriate for Leaders of Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA and Venturers. Training is a component of being certified as a "Trained" Nova Mentor.

Outdoor Ethics	From a Cub Scout's first hike in a local park to the thrill of our High Adventure bases, from our backyard to the backcountry, our outdoor ethics guide us to be responsible outdoor citizens. How do we maintain our outdoor ethics and preserve that tradition? By heeding the challenge in the Outdoor Code.
Religious Awards and Ceramones	Religious awards have been developed for many religious faith traditions. Come learn about the different awards that are available for Scouts to earn from facilitators who work with the youth to earn the awards.
Scout Hiking Programs for Packs & Troops	Prepare your Unit for hiking. Get resources for local hikes, recommendations for hiking gear and essentials, and learn how to teach your Cub Scouts outdoor ethics and about nature on the way.
Scoutmaster Specific	Scoutmaster Position-Specific training provides an active, fun, and positive learning experience for new and experienced Scoutmasters to learn and apply proven techniques for running an effective Boy Scout troop. Scoutmasters will learn how to meet the aims of Scouting by applying the eight methods of the Boy Scouting program.
Scouts with Disabilites	A hands on approach to understanding and working with Scouts who possess different ability levels. Come learn and share ways to help each Scout do THEIR BEST. All Scouts are capable, willing, and deserving of a quality program.
