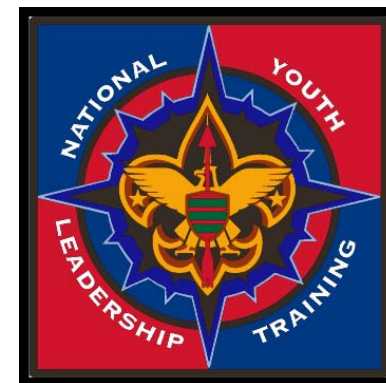

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF NYLT?

The aims of NYLT are to give each participant a basic knowledge of various leadership skills while helping them relate these skills to their own troop/crew responsibilities; to give them the confidence and knowledge necessary to run their troop/crew program; to provide an opportunity to share ideas and experiences with Scouts from other troops/crews; and of course, to have FUN.

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must BE, what he must KNOW, and what he must DO. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.

NYLT is a six-day course. Content is delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment.

Built on the legacy of past JLT successes, the new NYLT integrates the best of modern leadership theory with the traditional strengths of the Scouting experience. Through activities, presentations, challenges, discussions, and audio-visual support, NYLT participants will be engaged in a unified approach to leadership that will give them the skill and confidence to lead well. Through a wide range of activities, games, and adventures, participants will work and play together as they put into action the best Scouting has to offer.

RESERVATION DEADLINE

THE RESERVATION DEADLINE IS

July 5, 2012. The deposit of \$115.00 must be paid at the time of registration. Since space is limited to 48 participants, you need to register as early as possible to insure you have a place.

HOW IS THE SCOUTMASTER / CREW ADVISOR INVOLVED?

The conference is intended to strengthen the relationship between the Youth Leader and his/her Scoutmaster/Advisor. The unit leader will act as a Mentor for the Scout concerning his/her Vision Statement after he/she returns to the Troop/Crew

WHO MAY ATTEND?

Participants may be any current or future leader in any Scouting position. Also to be eligible to attend, they must be at least First Class in rank and thirteen years of age by January 1, 2012, or a registered member of a Venturing Crew. Each Scout must also have a working knowledge of camping, hiking, and cooking IN ALL WEATHER CONDITIONS and have the written approval of their Scoutmaster/Advisor.
